A hymn is a song of praise to God, a metrical composition adapted for singing in a religious service.

Let's look at the hymntune "Hyfrydol". In the Presbyterian Hymnal, copyrighted in 1990, this tune is sung to Hymn Number 2, "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus", Hymn Number 144, "Alleluia! Sing to Jesus!", and Hymn Number 376, "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling". This is a Welsh hymntune composed by Rowland H. Prichard in 1831. The place of origin is Wales. The reason there can be different hymn titles sung to the same hymntune is a common metric marking. Metric is a notation indicating the number of syllables in each line of a song. The metric marking for "Hyfrydol" is "8.7.8.7.D". There are alternating lines of 8 and 7 syllables and the "D" means double, instead of writing "8.7.", 4 times. Think of how many hymns you know with more than one tune.

Ephesians 5:19 - speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. That is what we do when we gather to worship.

News from the Board of Deacons

The Board of Deacons continues to be responsible for offering a caring hand to our congregation. The Prayer Chain, Deacon's Emergency Fund, Homebound Communion and Hospital Visitation are highlighted below.

The Prayer Chain:

Members of the Prayer Chain offer prayers for concerns brought to our attention. The current Prayer Chain consists of all the Church Officers (Elders and Deacons) and church members who have chosen to be a part of the Chain. The Prayer request is now emailed to each participant, with no requirement to call someone else and "pass it on". Those who do not have email access can be telephoned by a Deacon who will share the information. As a Prayer Chain member, you are asked to pray for the individual or family identified. If anyone has a prayer request to put on the Prayer Chain at any time, or if you would like your name added as a Prayer Chain member, please contact David Hohe.

The Deacons' Emergency Fund:

Established by the Board of Deacons, this Fund is targeted to assist church members who have unforeseen emergency expenses for housing, utilities, food, etc. and need financial assistance on a one time basis. The requests are kept confidential and acted on only by the Pastor and the Moderator of the Deacons. The Fund is still viable. If you are in need of emergency assistance, please contact David Hohe to have your request considered. Since our funding source, the Soup and Sandwich luncheons, have not yet resumed, any church members who are financially able and wish to support this ministry, may earmark donations for the Deacons' Emergency Fund and place them in the offering plate or mail them to the church office.

If you have been unable to attend worship in person due to medical or other concerns, please contact David Hohe to make arrangements to take communion at home.

Hospital Visitation
